Student Ride-Along Code of Conduct

All students riding with veterinarians at Clinton Veterinary Service must read and agree to this code of conduct.

- Students are to be neatly dressed and have a clean appearance.
 - If riding with the bovine vets: jeans and a polo shirt along with rubber boots and coveralls.
 - If riding with equine vets: khaki pants and a polo shirt with boots.
 - No holes in clothing.
 - Be aware of the weather and dress appropriately.

• Cell phones are <u>not permitted</u> when riding with the doctors. You can leave the clinic number with anyone that may need to reach you during the day (989-224-1410) and our staff can get in contact with you. You are here to learn not text.

- No cameras allowed unless prior authorization is given.
- Students are to leave car keys at the clinic with the office staff.

• Students are expected to call the office by <u>3pm the day before their rotation</u> starts to find out arrival time. Remember, we are not open on weekends so call Friday for a Monday ride-along. If you are late the doctors will not wait for you so you will be sent home. We have clients who expect is to be on time so we expect the same of you.

• Students need to pack a lunch to bring with them as we may be to busy to stop for lunch.

• For pre-veterinary students – keep a journal of dates and hours worked, interesting cases seen, etc. in case we need to write a letter of recommendation.

• Confidentiality – students are expected to keep client information confidential.

• Students should come with a list of learning objectives they wish to accomplish during their stay.

Students are expected to stay until day end. We work till all the work is done. We expect the same from them.
